## **Ask Izzy**

From July 1, 2022, Council will no longer receive referrals from the DHS Coronavirus Hotline to provide food relief to community members isolating from COVID-19. Community members are asked to check on Ask Izzy for their food relief needs.

# **Wellbeing and support services**

We offer support services for a range of issues, including mental health, emergency relief, drugs and alcohol, and homelessness. We run a care program to support eligible people under 65 and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people under 50. <u>Find out more</u> about how we can support you.

## Emergency Relief

If you need help to find food relief and essential items you can call our Customer Service team on (03) 8470 8888.

Council is working with local services to increase access to food relief for households in Darebin. We are currently providing about 300 households with weekly food relief through our partnership with local agencies.

#### Drugs and alcohol

Council works with community, organisations and agencies to minimise the negative impacts of alcohol and other drugs on our community.

To support our residents access information, advice and referrals on alcohol and other drug use, we have developed a pocket-sized <u>Alcohol and Other Drugs Quick Reference Guide.</u>



#### Care support

Darebin's Home and Community Care Program for Younger People (HACC PYP) assists eligible people aged under 65 (and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people under 50), who need support to manage activities of daily living or are caring for someone who needs support.

Council's HACC PYP officer can undertake a holistic Living at Home Assessment to understand a person's need. Our officer will explore ways for the person to live independently and remain active in their community.

## Homelessness

Council supports people seeking housing and homelessness assistance by providing information and referral to local support agencies. A number of services in Darebin are offering assistance to people in need of housing and homelessness support.

# • Maternal and Child Health

Council's Maternal and Child Health (MCH) service supports your family with parenting, health and development. We can also offer referrals to other professionals. You and your child will have regular appointments from birth to 4 years of age.

MCH nurses are registered general nurses with postgraduate qualifications in midwifery and child health.

We provide 10 key ages and stages consultations with a MCH nurse, including:

a home visit after your baby is born

- consultations at two weeks, one month, two months, four months, eight months, 12 months, 18 months, two years and three and a half years
- > an additional maternal health check at three months.

#### Our nurses will:

- > assess your child's health, development and wellbeing
- > listen to your parenting experiences and any concerns
- provide guidance, emotional support and education on childhood illnesses and behaviour.

The service is free and strictly confidential.

You can also call our 24-hour Maternal and Child Health line on 13 22 29.

We can also provide extra support if you're having significant additional early parenting difficulties. Your nurse will make any necessary referrals.
