

Energy Efficiency tips for renters

1. Switch off lights and electrical appliances when you are not using them



Turn off your heater, cooling units and appliances when you go to bed or leave the house.

2. Switch to energy-saving LED light globes



Energy-efficient globes could save you up to 80 per cent off your lighting costs. LED bulbs use less power and last longer.

3. Shut doors and close curtains



Shut doors to areas you're not using, and only cool or heat the rooms where you spend the most time. Close curtains or blinds when the sun has gone down. Block draughts around doors and windows.

4. Save energy when you wash and dry clothes



Wash clothes in cold water. Choose a short wash cycle. Wait until your machine is full before starting the washing machine.

Clothes dryers use lots of energy. Hang clothes outside and let them dry naturally or hang them on a clothes rack indoors.

5. Save energy in the kitchen



Fridge: Your fridge runs 24 hours a day and is one of your most expensive appliances to run. Make sure the fridge door seal is tight and that no gaps or cracks let cold air escape. If you have a second fridge or freezer, only turn it on when you need it.

Cooking: Microwaves use much less energy than an electric oven.

6. Manage your heating and cooling



Every degree above 20 degrees can add 10 per cent to your heating bill. In winter heating can account for over 30 per cent of your bill. In winter, set your thermostat between 18 and 20 degrees. In summer, set your thermostat to 26 degrees or above.

7. Get the best energy deal



One of the easiest ways to reduce energy costs is to compare energy offers.

Victorian Energy Compare is the Victorian Government's free and independent energy price comparison tool. It can help you find the best and cheapest energy offers.

If you would like help to pay your power bills and use less energy in your home, you can contact Uniting on 1800 313 126 or energy@vt.uniting.com. Their Energy Support team can help you understand your bills, talk with your energy provider and get help to pay your bills, and suggest simple steps to save energy in your home. Interpreters are available.

Power Saving Bonus

If you are receiving a government payment you might be eligible for the Power Saving Bonus. It is a payment of \$250. You can apply online at compare.energy.vic.gov.au If you need help to apply, you can call the team at Good Shepherd on 1300 026 500. Applications close on 31 January 2022.

Appliance Energy Rating

If you are buying a new appliance like a fridge, try and choose one with the most energy efficiency stars. More stars means that it uses less energy. It might cost a little more to buy, but will save you money over time. You can learn more at www.energyrating.gov.au

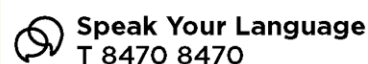
