Most people who live in Darebin want our community to take urgent action on the climate emergency to protect our planet and ensure a safe future for all living things. At Darebin Council, we are working hard to protect our planet and people, and we are here to support you to take action!

#### What is the climate emergency?

The climate emergency refers to dangerous changes to the world's climate caused by human activity. These changes mean our earth is getting hotter and our weather patterns are more unstable – leading to the megafires we experienced in early 2020, floods, severe ongoing drought and other extreme weather events which threaten our planet and our future.

To protect our planet and ensure a safe future for all life on earth we must:

- 1. <u>Stop producing greenhouse gases</u> that are produced by coal, oil and gas and
- 2. <u>Remove current greenhouse gases</u> from the atmosphere.

More and more people are facing the urgent challenge of responding to the climate emergency. We have the solutions, and when we work together we can move quickly to protect our community and our planet.



# How is Council taking action on the climate emergency?

In 2016, Darebin was the first government in the world to declare a climate emergency, recognising that we need fast and coordinated action to address the climate emergency. Since then more than 1500 governments around the world and almost 100 in Australia have done the same.

In Darebin we are focusing on:

## • Reducing and drawing down our greenhouse gases

We are powering <u>Council facilities and</u> <u>our community with renewable energy</u>, replacing inefficient streetlighting, improving access to <u>sustainable</u> <u>transport</u> and <u>rewilding our city</u>.

### • Supporting our communities to take action

We are reaching out to and supporting people in Darebin to come together and take action on the climate emergency.

### • Calling for strong climate action from state and federal governments

This is a global emergency. We are calling on State and Federal governments to lead rapid action to reduce our greenhouse gases and protect our planet.

#### Working together with other Councils

We are <u>working closely with other</u> <u>councils</u> who have declared a climate emergency to share information and help each other

#### At home

- Consider how your everyday actions contribute to greenhouse gases, and work towards reducing them
- Review your banking, insurance and superannuation to ensure your money is not supporting fossil fuels
- Explore Sustainability Victoria's ideas on how to save energy at home



#### **Out and about**

- Swap driving your car for <u>sustainable</u> <u>transport alternatives</u> such as cycling, public transport and walking where possible
- Ride your bike to work the <u>Darebin Travel</u>
   <u>Smart Map</u> will help you plan your journey
- Consider a local holiday and <u>visit some of</u> <u>the incredible parks and beaches</u> we have in Victoria

## How do we keep going and stay hopeful?

You are not alone. <u>Most Victorians agree</u> that climate change requires urgent action, but we often feel as if we are the only ones who care. Taking any of the actions above can be useful if you are feeling down or anxious about the climate emergency: as <u>Greta Thunberg</u> says, "The one thing we need more than hope is action.
