Clarification to the Minutes of the Ordinary Council Meeting on 22 November 2021

A public question was submitted online for the Ordinary Council Meeting on the 22 November 2021 from Ms Di Woodcroft of Northcote.

Ms Woodcroft's question was as follows;

'Is it possible to make an appointment to meet with the General Manager that City Works reports to regarding systemic service problems in this area?'

Prior to the Council Meeting the General Manager Operations & Capital contacted Ms Woodcroft and on the basis of this advice the Coordinator Council Business made the judgement that the presentation of the question to the Council Meeting was not necessary. Ms Woodcroft has request that the Minutes of the 22nd November 2021 reflect her submitted question and in the interests of transparency it is recommended that this clarification be made.

6. QUESTION AND SUBMISSION TIME

The Chairperson, Cr Messina, responded to the following questions submitted for Public Question Time.

• Carolyn Lunt of Northcote

Since the introduction of the cat curfew 7pm until 7am. How many residents in the City of Darebin have been fined / prosecuted? I ask this question as I see cats roaming between these hours quite close to the Merri Creek

<u>Response</u>

Since the curfew was introduced in early 2021 we have responded to reports of stray animals by containing and collecting them. We have not issued any fines in this period.

The main reason for this is that the first time we collect an animal, we educate the owner and give them a chance to change their behaviour. We would consider enforcement action if the issue reoccurs.

Since the cat curfew was introduced 285 cats were contained and collected by Council including 49 collected out of hours. Many caught are not microchipped and are either community cats without one owner, or feral. We responded to a further 221 reports of cat nuisance and requests for cat cages to trap animals.

• Hayden Jones of Reservoir

Question 1

In early 2020, the City of Darebin constructed a re-alignment of the intersection between Cheddar Road and Carrol Street, Reservoir to prevent westbound traffic from crossing

Cheddar Road to turn right onto Cheddar Road. Since this was completed, vehicles exiting Carrol Street now routinely turn right and drive towards oncoming traffic for the purposes of crossing Cheddar Road and turning right. How will council address this dangerous behaviour before a serious injury or fatality occurs?

Question 2

In addition to this, the City of Darebin advised me in early 2021 (C/21/6921) that the speed limit of Cheddar Road would be decreased to 50km/h in the next 3-4 months. This has not occurred. Does Council still intend to reduce the speed limit for the benefit and safety of residents? When will this occur?

Response

Officers have been working closely and in an ongoing capacity with Victoria Police to monitor and enforce correct driver behaviour on Cheddar Road. Victoria Police have issued over 25 infringement notices since the start of September for motorists driving illegally at this intersection.

I can confirm that Council is working to reduce the speed limit on Cheddar Road. The applications require detailed analysis and take some time. The next steps are to submit an application to the Department of Transport with the proposed changes; however, DoT are currently not taking applications while a system upgrade is being undertaken. We anticipate this may delay implementation until late 2022. I am sorry this is longer than you were initially advised

• Elif Cetiner of Thornbury

Can the Council please update us on what progress has been made on the Mayer Park Masterplan since it was approved by Council in August 2020?

Response

Council recently upgraded the sports field lighting at Mayer Park and works will soon start on kitchen and electrical renewal works to the pavilion.

Other elements of the Masterplan will be considered by Council when it considers future budgets.

• Diane Woodcroft of Northcote

Could I please meet with Darebin CEO, in person, regarding systemic bin service and street sweeping issues? I would be happy to come to Council or meet at my residence, on an agreed date and time. This issue has been occurring for 4 to 5 months and liaising with each level of management has not been successful. I will be attending the meeting to hear this question read and am not seeking telephone calls as what occurred previously, and my question was not read out on the November 22nd's Council meeting—making last month's meeting minutes inaccurate. My preferred method of contact to arrange a meeting with the Darebin Council CEO is by telephone.

In desperation of trying to have a face to face meeting originally with the General Manager and now the Darebin CEO to try and have consistent bin service and effective Street sweeping for my Street, I've come to the realisation that letter dropping council residents to try for a reduction of services rather than put an extra burden on some of our rate payers should be done. I'm astonished that ratepayers are being asked to pay more for a service that has been so problematic recently, when during our pandemic it was so excellent. Personally, I am in despair in trying to get this service to work and truly want to have a face-to-face meeting with the CEO to fix the service that we pay so dearly for at this end of town. Can this person please meet with me so that I may outline the problems that have occurred and CCTV footage showing it. This includes just this week. I would greatly appreciate being contacted by phone to arrange an appointment.

Response from CEO, Sue Wilkinson

Thanks Ms Woodcroft, I am happy to meet with you, I have asked my office to contact you today to set up a time possibly early in the New Year and we will continue to pursue this matter.

• Penelope Bennett of Kew

The popup cycle lane on Victoria Rd has been completed for some time now but painting yellow lines and sometimes even removing the bike lane, and not removing short lengths of car parking or limiting car turns means people cycling are faced with just as much, if not more danger, with narrow/non-existent lanes and high car traffic volumes and poor motorist behaviour. Drivers are driving over the rumble strips and in the cycle lanes. What monitoring and evaluation has/is taking place and how will outcomes be made public? It is a council road (not a declared road) and with ongoing construction traffic, truck and dogs, etc, when will Council work with DoT for a better, safer outcome, including a safer speed limit, which will make it safer for all, including children crossing to the various schools nearby?

<u>Response</u>

Council is seeking lower speeds in this area. DoT have told us they need a detailed study of the whole area to consider a speed limit reduction. The reason for this is to be confident that the change won't create more rat running and higher speeds on nearby local roads. Council has scheduled a detailed study of this area next financial year and will also formally apply for a speed limit reduction.

• Ruth Jelley of Northcote

Question 1

In October I asked about the Octopus Schools program, which you informed us was no longer receiving funding. You noted that "Council is using a new approach to working with schools on safe travel this year". What is that new approach, and does it involve any active steps other than community consultation under the Local Area Place Management (LAPM) approach to the north-west third of Darebin?

Question 2

What action is being taken in the rest of Darebin to ensure school children have access to safe infrastructure to walk, ride, scoot or skate to school?

Question 3

Is Council considering rolling out 30 km/hr zones close to schools in Darebin?

<u>Response</u>

- 1. Councils new approach to treating traffic is called Your Street Your Say. This approach allows us to look at issues around schools in conjunction with broader travel issues in neighbourhoods.
- 2. The rest of Darebin will be investigated over the next 2 financial years. 30 Darebin primary schools have undertaken audits as part of our Safe Travel to School program resulting in improvements to safety, walking and cycling over the last 10 years.
- 3. There are no plans to roll out 30km/h speed zones. Council is continuing to work with the Department of Transport to implement 40km/h area-wide speed zones.

• Matt Courtney of Thornbury

Given that Golf Australia's CEO James Sutherland recently emailed golfers around Australia and overseas asking them to respond to Darebin Council's survey on Northcote Golf Course even if they'd 'never been to Northcote or seen the course', what actions will Council take to ensure that the voice of local residents and particularly young people is not lost because of the survey-flooding behaviour of those with no stake in our community?

How many people responded to the survey, what percentage were from Darebin and neighbouring councils and what percentage where from children and young people?

How is the Council able to determine whether those claiming to be from Darebin and neighbouring councils are being truthful and not misrepresenting themselves, as Golf Australia have encouraged them to do?

<u>Response</u>

The survey platform captures location data including IP address which allows Council to understand where the survey was completed.

Council will receive all the data from the survey including the views of those from Darebin and those from other locations.

We know that approximately 11,000 survey responses have been received.

It's too soon to provide any breakdown or further information on the survey responses as there is a lot to analyse but we hope to have a summary available to the community in early 2022.

Linda Green of Coburg

At a community information session last week (6th December 2021) at the Aboriginal Advancement League a fellow member of the Normanby Park Golf Club made a presentation at which 5 Darebin Councillors and a Council Officer were present. I would like to enquire as to whether the written submission that accompanied that presentation could be tabled, minuted and presented as a hard copy this evening to the CEO, Mayor, all Councillors and the Officer responsible for the consultation process on the Northcote Public Golf Course?

Bill Jennings of West Preston

I am a representative of the Northcote Community and Golf Hub and we are very grateful to the five Councillors who attended and the Council Officer who attended the Aboriginal Advancement League, last Monday night with over 120 people in attendance.

Question 1

I would like to enquire as to whether the written submission that accompanied that presentation could be tabled and minuted and presented as a hard copy this evening to the CEO, the Mayor, all Councillors and the Officer responsible for the Consultation process on the Northcote Public Golf Course?

Question 2

The Northcote Community and Golf Hub along with the Normanby Park Golf Club, the Northcote Golf Club and the Save Northcote Golf Course group are some of the groups listed as a stakeholder in the consultation process exploring shared use of the Northcote Public Golf Course. Our group has struggled to receive a clear answer from Council officers as to how the voices of these listed stakeholders will be heard in the upcoming submission phase in February 2022. Can Council assure all listed stakeholders that they will be given an opportunity to make public submissions?

Question 3

In the online Q&A conducted by Darebin Council on Tuesday 7 December, the Manager of Recreation and Libraries, Felicity Leahy, responded to a question I asked about the list of Council principles guiding the current consultation process on the future shared use of the Northcote Public Golf Course. These were displayed on a slide in the online meeting. I was grateful that Felicity Leahy indicated that residents' participation in community sport is a guiding principle of Darebin Council and that the omission of such a principle on the list might have been an oversight. Can Council please add that principle to the list of guiding principles for the remainder of this consultation period on the Your Say page?

• Clive Enos of Thornbury

At a community information meeting last Monday night the 6th of December 2021 at the Aboriginal Advancement League, as a representative of the Northcote Golf Club, I made a presentation with five Darebin Councillors and a Council officer present at that meeting. I would like to enquire as to whether the written submission that accompanied that presentation could be tabled and minuted and presented as a hard copy this evening to the CEO, the Mayor, all Councillors and the Officer responsible for the consultation process on the Northcote Public Golf Course?

Response from Sam Hewitt, General Manager, Operations and Capital to Linda Green, Bill Jennings and Clive Enos questions

Given the size of the response we have had to the consultation, over 11,000 responses. Officers are designing the next stage and we have committed to conducting a Hearing of Submissions type process. As it is a logistical challenge, we are trying to design it now. We can assure stakeholders they will be given an opportunity to be heard.

Officers have a hard copy of the submission from the community meeting and this will form part of Council's consultation process for the golf course. Councillors will consider this submission along with all other submissions sometime in the new year.

Thank you for the advice regarding the Council principles issue. This will be rectified on Councils website

I wish to inform those persons who have lodged these questions that whilst our Governance Rules disallow questions on Notices of Motion – our Officers will respond to your questions in writing after this meeting.

John Nugent

Question 1

Could you please advise if the mean-spirited instructions delivered by your General Manager that there will be no photo coping of anything for the customers who come to front desk in Customer Service. Will this policy change in 2022?

Question 2

Could you please advise when will the Preston Market parking and leasing out the City Oval to NFNL in September be finalised? Mayor Messina this is your ward and you also know that the shopkeepers lose between 10 and 20% of their income on match days. Mayor Messina isn't about time that this Council finally looked out for the shopkeepers? There is a win/win situation (available) but it's not up to me to tell highly paid executives what is the resolution?

Question 3

Could you please advise if our Managers are responsible for checking that the work force start work on time then Mayor Messina who checks that the Executive staff start work on time?

<u>Response</u>

Thank you Mr Nugent, your questions will be taken on notice and the relevant General Manager will get back to you.

• Kate Jost of Reservoir

Friends of Edwardes Lake are looking forward to the Edwardes water quality task force commencing.

We are committed to the hard work ahead along with those who are already actively involved in improving the water quality in the catchment.

We look forward to continuing working with the group and Council collaboratively to develop the terms of reference for the task force.

Mayor Messina thanked Ms Jost for her statement.

Carolyn Lunt of Northcote

Councillors you may not be aware that the green material used to make the bike lanes is coming away from the surface of the road and is collecting in the gutters. This material seems to be glass or plastic and will end up in our waterways.

Question 1

What is Council doing to prevent this litter from entering our waterways?

On Friday 3 December I noticed slurry flowing onto the Merri Creek bank, the slurry had come from 8 Ross Street. They were having their roof done and the roofing company washed the slurry down the stormwater drain. For 35 years of my 40 years living there I have been trying to get Council to look at the illegal stormwater flow.

I rang the Council on 3 December, and they said to ring the EPA. I rang the EPA who emailed me and stated it was a Council responsibility. Council is looking at it but it took 8 days. This shows that the Council and the EPA, nobody is really concerned about our water ways.

Question 2

What is the Council doing to address the issue of an illegal stormwater drain and to remove the slurry in a careful manner.

Response from Sue Wilkinson, Chief Executive Officer

In relation to the green material used in the bike lanes, thank you for bringing that to my attention and I will take the sample. We will have to investigate your question and get back to you.

In relation to slurry and the discharge into Merri Creek, I can't answer that right now as I wasn't aware of it. What I will do is speak to the relevant General Manager and I will ensure that they give you a call tomorrow.

Chris Erlandsen of Preston

The future Advisory Standing Committee which will sit mid next year in their hearing to determine the future of Preston Market. They will be informed by all relevant Council documentation that has been produced.

Which documents will most inform the hearing? There is Preston Central Structure Plan 2006, Preston Central Structure Plan 2021 Draft & Preston Central Structure Plan 2020-2050,

Preston Central Incorporated Plan 2007 & 2014, Heart of Preston and/or alternatively the Councils recent submission to the VPA.

Which one of these would be most relevant?

Response from Sue Wilkinson, Chief Executive Officer

It's difficult to describe a hierarchy but Council's submission to the VPA clearly states Councils adopted and current position. I will seek advice and clarification from Officers for you but I would think we would provide all of those documents if requested by the panel and we would put the most emphasis on Council position in the Heart of Preston document

I write to you on behalf of a lot of dog owners and their children (mostly under 12 years of age) who live within 1 km radius of the above precincts.

Bill Lawry Oval was a blessing for all of us over the last 2 years, when Melbourne was predominantly in lockdown, as we could take our dogs and enjoy some freedom by watching them run and play with other dogs whilst the owners maintained respectful COVID safe distances. The kids would often come with their dogs and run along with them and have a play. This space has formed good friendships and helped support the mental health and wellbeing of nearly 20-30 dogs, their owners and families, it is reflected in the number of signatories to this letter.

We have, with admiration and concern, seen a recent proposal of upgrading the Oval. We are thrilled to have a first-class sports precinct close to our homes but are concerned about access for us, our children and dogs to this public precinct; and are extremely worried about it's impact on the traffic, parking and on the environment.

Most of us are families with young children and with essential (healthcare) workers who have always strived to support local community and make Darebin a nice place to call home. We would, respectfully, like the Council to engage with us to hear our concerns and discuss possible solutions to address them.

Our appeal is for Council to designate an adequate space in these precincts that is fenced and safe for our dogs and children to run around without the fear of being hit by a cricket ball or bump into a player.

8. CONSIDERATION OF REPORTS

8.1 CONTRACT AWARD CT202171 - VICTORIA ST PRESTON, ROAD REHABILITATION

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Council has an ongoing road rehabilitation program to improve the condition, safety and appearance of its network of roads. Victoria Street Preston, between Neale Street and Raglan Street, was identified for rehabilitation in the 2021/2022 capital works program, due to its aging condition and high traffic count.
