NAIDOC AWARD FOR UNCLE ALAN THORPE

Uncle Alan Thorpe, a Gunai man and leader of the Darebin-based Dardi Munwurro ('Strong Spirit' in Gunai language), was announced 2023 Victorian Male Elder of the Year in the annual NAIDOC Week Awards.

While Uncle Alan may have been surprised, it certainly came as no surprise to many in the Darebin community and to so many Aboriginal men from across Victoria who have benefited from the work and programs of Dardi Munwurro.

It is an organisation that started in the 1990s, with Uncle Alan and a colleague travelling across Victoria in a second-hand Holden Commodore, working in various communities to support healing for Aboriginal men.

Now, nearly 25 years later, it stays true to its roots and runs various programs that assist Aboriginal men, many of them emerging from periods of incarceration, to gain employment, healing and, as the name of the organisation states clearly, stronger spirit.

For Alan, the reward is not the recognition of being Male Elder of the Year; it is seeing the men working hard through the Dardi Munwurro programs and changing for the better.

"That's where I gain my own inspiration," he says. "To see them recognise in themselves the people they really are - strong, confident and resilient."

While the focus of Dardi Munwurro and Alan's work has been on men's healing, he has never turned his back on anyone, and that is fundamental to the work undertaken by Dardi.

"The core philosophy that I hold to, and embed within the organisation is that we strive to ensure that we leave no-one behind."

"Everyone is valuable and deserves our support."

JUMP FOR JOY, NARC IS OPEN

The Northcote Aquatic and Recreation Centre is now open!

Every detail of the facility has been carefully thought through to bring to life a sustainable and truly inclusive space where the whole community can feel embraced, safe and welcome.

Few have had a closer eye on it than Warren and Mahoney Associate Principal and Project Architect, Brett Diprose, who took the brief from Darebin Council, and created the 6 Star Green Star design that now sets the standard for future aquatic centres in Australia.

Brett says in addition to the centre's fantastic leisure facilities and sustainability credentials - which include significant use of solar, all electric (no gas connection to site) and other initiatives - NARC is about inclusion.

"Accessibility and balance are at the heart of this design and have been executed brilliantly by our construction partners, KANE. The breadth of facilities, the layout - including a specific adult-only bathing area, expansive café and sprawling grounds surrounding the outdoor pool - enables this centre to truly act as a community hub," he said.

Aside from the wide array of recreation facilities, there are some important operational elements of the design that drive inclusivity.

Change facilities are welcoming to a cross section of the community, with options that cater to individuals, families and those reliant on high-need carers.

Darebin resident Amelia said she finds the facility affirming and likes the safety of the individual shower and change rooms.











"It is incredible to have a space where sexuality and gender diverse experiences are considered in the planning, building and activity planning," she said.

The centre has been designed to be used by the Darebin and wider community. It will be available for local and district school carnivals and could host swimming and water polo competitions.

Andy who came along to have a look with his local grandson said

he was very impressed by the facility and is keen to sign up.

"It's really quite amazing to be honest. I am really impressed. I'll certainly be coming along to whatever you have on offer for seniors of my vintage," he said.

The Northcote Aquatic and Recreation Centre is all about inclusion and providing a great experience to everyone in the community from young babies right through to the elderly, with targeted programming in pools and wellness spaces, to keep our community healthy, strong and connected.

Whether you are visiting for the hour, or the day, the Northcote Aquatic and Recreation Centre is ready to welcome you to work towards your health and wellbeing goals.

MAKE FOOD WASTE RECYCLING YOUR NEW YEAR'S RESOLUTION

Did you know that 43% of the waste in our kerbside landfill bin is food waste that could be placed in our green bins? Also, contamination from plastics, general waste and other items in green bins has more than doubled in the last year since rolling out Food Organics and Garden Organics (FOGO) collection to eligible households.

When food and green waste ends ups in landfill, it generates methane and has a big environmental impact and financial cost. Everything that goes into your food and green waste bin will be turned into compost for farms, parks and community gardens across Victoria. Will you pledge to recycle better as your New Year's resolution?

Darebin resident Blaze Ristanodski has pledged this New Year to recycle right. "I didn't know I could use the green bin for kitchen waste, but I will do it now" says Blaze. "I will tell my friends in the Macedonian Club. Already I see no problem. It is so easy!"

And if you are worried about a smelly bin during summer, these simple tips can help keep your food and green waste bin odour and pest free:

- Layer items like garden clippings at the bottom of the bin and between food scraps. This will stop food from sticking to the bottom and help keep your bin smelling fresh.
- 2. Keep your bin in a shady spot with the lid closed.
- 3. Keep seafood and meat scraps in the fridge or freezer until bin collection day.
- 4. Hose the bin down and let it dry in the sun.

The scheme also gives charities, clubs, and community groups some new and easy ways to raise funds by either registering as a donation partner, starting a collection drive, or running a refund point. Businesses also have an opportunity to participate by partnering with Visy to become an over-the-counter refund location.

"We save up our bottles and cans for a few weeks, and then take them to the reverse vending machine." Says Preston local, Isaac.

"It's fun to use and it's good for the environment, plus I get to keep the money!"

We look forward to seeing the scheme continue to grow and thrive in Darebin, reducing litter and landfill waste while providing some additional income to community groups, businesses, and individuals.
