Darebin Falcons Vice President Jasmine Hirst says the lights are important for the girls and women playing at the club.

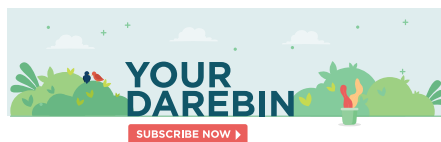
"These lights mean more space to train on at convenient times and locations, more space to develop

their skills and play the game they love, experience teamwork, leadership, have fun with their friends and immerse themselves in their community," Jasmine says.

"But they are also a symbol to these girls and women that their involvement in sport is legitimate, encouraged, supported and valued, not just by their families and our club, but by governments and the community as a whole."

Mayor Cr Julie Williams and Member for Preston Nathan Lambert joined local clubs for the switching on of the new lights.

The project was jointly funded by Council and the State Government through the Community Sports Stimulus Infrastructure Fund and the World Game Facilities Program.

JOIN DAREBIN'S NEWEST FITNESS AND AQUATIC FACILITY

Preston residents Bridget, Anna and the family are ready to immerse themselves in Darebin's new state-of-the-art aquatic and leisure centre opening later this year.

Bridget said they can't wait to get to a heated 50-metre pool in their area. She plans to do laps twice a week and also bring the kids to meet up with their friends.

"It will increase my fitness levels, improve my mental health, and allow me to connect with friends I used to go swimming with at Northcote pool," Bridget says.

"The designs look fantastic. Lots of grassy outdoor area to meet up with people over summer and the splash play areas outside and indoors will be a drawcard for our kids."

The Northcote Aquatic and Recreation Centre reached its end-of-life and is being redeveloped so it can meet the needs of Darebin's growing population well into the future.

The 6-Star Green Star rated facility will offer a fully accessible experience with indoor and outdoor heated pools, gymnasium, group fitness rooms, café, creche, outdoor fitness training area and ample parking for bikes, scooters or cars, including EV stations.

Membership options are customisable to suit everyone's needs - choose from Aquatic, Health and Wellness, Group Fitness and Specialised Programs zones, along with Teen Gym, Active Adults and Swim Bright. You only need to pay for what you'll use.

The new centre is expected to be complete and ready for the community to enjoy by the end of this year.

“Obviously we love Australia because Australia is a country that gave us the opportunity to live the life we want. And a lot of opportunities to grow in my career especially, I’m a nurse,” Manpreet said.

Rezina Pradhan said it was an emotional and overwhelming day.

“It’s been amazing to call Australia my second home,” Rezina said.

“Definitely overwhelming with teary eyes and I could see the happiness of all the families and all the individuals celebrating love and respect and equal opportunity in Australia.”

As a proudly diverse community and a Welcoming City, we’re excited we can once again hold citizenship ceremonies to support and celebrate our new Australian citizens on one of the most important days of their lives.

In April we held our first citizenship ceremonies since 2017, led by Darebin Mayor Cr Julie Williams. We have now welcomed 580 new citizens across six ceremonies.

PRESTON MARKET UPDATE

Since the State Government became the planning authority for the Preston Market Precinct in 2017, we’ve advocated alongside our community to see it protected on its current site with its cultural and social values preserved.

In April this year, this advocacy and the hard work of our community was recognised with the Premier announcing the State Government supported key findings of the Standing Advisory Committee’s report, including stronger heritage controls to protect the market.

We now await the Planning Minister’s final decision on the Preston Market Precinct Amendment.

We’ll continue to advocate to see Preston Market and its traders protected into the future.

A BALANCED BUDGET FOR ALL

From parks and open space, recreation and sustainable transport, to aged care and community wellbeing, our 2023-24 Budget has been carefully developed to deliver the services you told us were most important, underpinned by a strong focus on financial sustainability.

On 26 June, following two stages of community consultation, Councillors adopted the 2023-24 Budget and supporting financial documents.

The 2023-24 Budget is community focused, delivering projects and services that are highly valued by residents, businesses and visitors.

We're investing more than \$110 million in operational services, including:

- \$15 million towards open spaces, parks and natural environment services
- \$2.4 million towards sustainable transport services
- \$15 million towards aged and disability services
- \$10.5 million towards facilities and infrastructure management and maintenance
- \$3.6 million towards community wellbeing, equity and diversity services
- \$10.8 million towards recreation and leisure services
- \$24.4 million towards waste management services
- \$9 million towards families, youth and children services
- \$8.7 million towards creative culture and community facilities services

- \$5.7 million towards libraries and learning services
- \$5.6 million towards climate emergency and environment services
- \$3 million towards economic development services.

We're also investing \$30 million in capital projects, including:

- \$950,000 on land and land contamination
- \$5.4 million on building renewals
- \$1.9 million on plant, machinery and equipment renewals
- \$750,000 on library books
- \$18.5 million to renew and upgrade key infrastructure including roads, bridges, footpaths and cycleways, drainage, recreational, leisure and community facilities, waste management, parks, open space and streetscapes.

Mayor Cr Julie Williams says feedback gave a clear view of the community's priorities during these financially challenging times.

"We recognise we need to strike a balance between delivering the core services that are so important to our community, and safeguarding Darebin's financial stability into the future," Cr Williams says.

"We know times are tough and it's more important than ever that our budget continues to support a vibrant and connected Darebin."

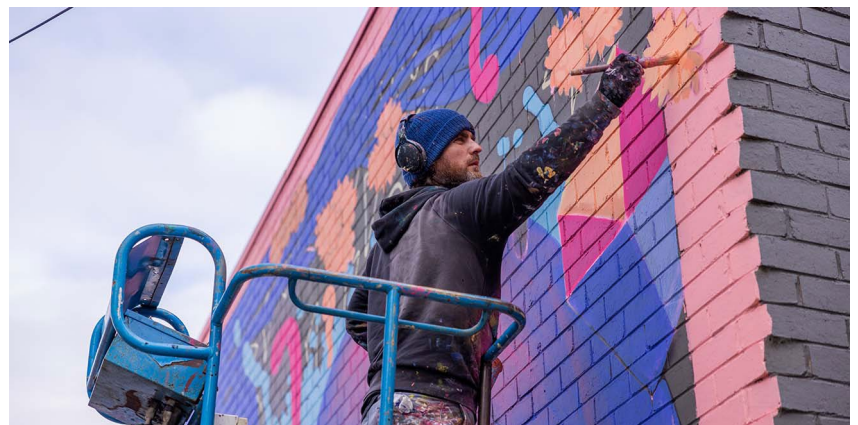

GOING ELECTRIC

Darebin resident Margaret Moore has been concerned about climate change for many years.

Now in her ninth decade, she's still doing all she can by electrifying her home.

"I looked around my house and thought 'what can I change?'" Margaret says.

"I started with my split system to replace my gas heating. The difference in my winter energy bills was phenomenal."

"I've recently got solar panels up top (through Council's Solar Saver program). I'm researching induction cooktops, and if I live long enough, I'll replace my gas hot water system with electric too."

Margaret is happy to be saving money by moving away from gas. But in the end, climate change remains her main motivation.

"We're all individually in our households trying to do something and that's what counts. You might not be able to do much, but if you can do something, start there."

Whether you're a homeowner, renter, landlord or business, nearing retirement or raising a young family, replacing an appliance or renovating, you can be part of the growing movement to go electric.

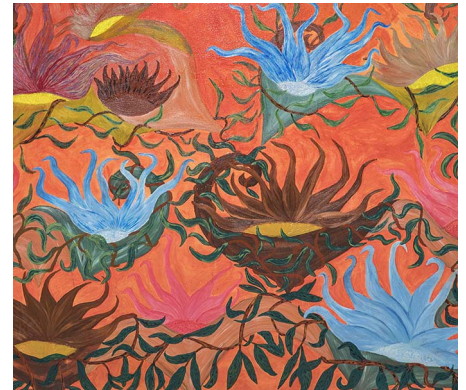

US MOB - CELEBRATING VICTORIAN KOORI ELDERS

In building on Darebin Council's *Statement of Commitment to Traditional Owners and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander People*, Bundoora Homestead Art Centre is hosting an exciting new exhibition called *Us Mob*.

Opening on 1 July and running through to 23 September, the exhibition features a breath-taking diversity of artistic styles, mediums and expressions of First Nations artists who attended the Indigenous Art Unit at RMIT University's School of Art between 2005 and 2012.

The artists featured in the exhibition are among the most innovative and well-known First Nations artists from South Eastern Australia.

They include Auntie Bunta Patten, Auntie Frances Gallagher, Uncle Herb Patten, Auntie Gwen Garoni, Auntie Gwen Brooke, Uncle Kennedy Edwards, Auntie Lorraine Nelson, Uncle Ray Thomas and Uncle Talgium Edwards.

The exhibition is curated by three equally highly regarded experts - Sharon West, Bundoora Homestead Art Centre's inaugural artist-in-residence, Dr Lyndon Ormond-Parker, an *Alyawarra* (Northern Territory) man and cultural heritage expert with significant experience in the fields of repatriation, archives, information technologies, materials conservation, heritage and policy, and Simon Rose, a *Birriah/Gurreng Gurreng Murri* man and well-known documentary producer.

Sharon, who mentored many of the artists during her years as a visual artist at RMIT, says the exhibition gives insight into the broader experience of Elders.

"A significant number of the pieces we are fortunate enough to include in this exhibition are stark portrayals of the personal experiences of the artists," Sharon says.

"While this is by no means unique in itself, this particular collection and resulting exhibition is a marvellous opportunity for visitors to gain at least a small insight into the broader experiences of some of this state's Aboriginal Elders."

Us Mob is running from 1 July - 23 September at Bundoora Homestead Art Centre.

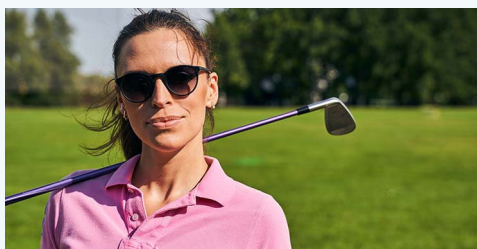

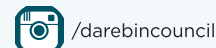
