

Today we are visiting Bundoora Park Farm

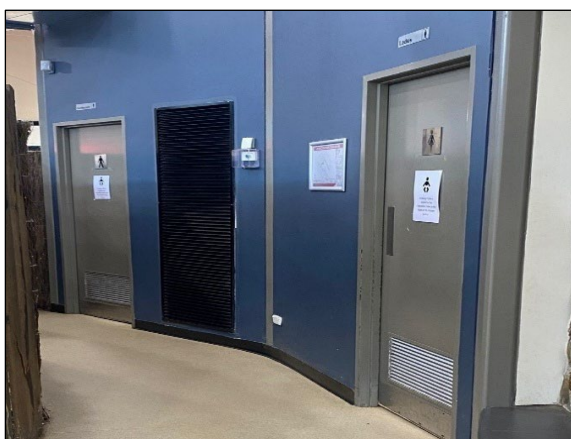
We will go on a bus to get there. When we arrive, we go in through the café. Sometimes it is busy and noisy inside.



We usually have our morning snack outside the cafe. If it rains, we will go to the barn instead.



There are toilets in the café. There are also toilets at the farm.



We get to do lots of different activities at the farm. Each group will do the activities at a different time.

We need to listen to the farmers when they are talking to us. We can also ask questions and join in with discussions.



We will meet lots of different animals. The farmer will tell us about them and show us how to pat and feed them.

There are some animals we can't touch, so we must follow instructions.

It's important to touch the animals gently so we don't hurt them.



Some of the animals are noisy, but they have nice soft noses. It tickles when they eat from our hands. Sometimes the farm is a bit smelly!



Animals can get scared if we are noisy and run around. So, it's important to be quiet and walk instead of running.

We are going to do some garden activities. Some activities can be a bit smelly, but they are really fun! We need to share the materials we use in the gardens.

The plants belong to other people so we can't pick them.



The farmer will take us on a ride to see the kangaroos and emus. We usually go in the safari bus but sometimes we go in the big trailer with hay bales instead.



We will learn about the animals and their home. Kangaroos and emus are wild animals so we can't touch them. We need to keep our hands and feet inside and stay sitting down.

It's important to be quiet and calm, so we don't scare the animals.



In the farm classroom, we will talk about animals and what they need to be healthy. We can all join in the discussion, but we need to put our hand up and wait for our turn to speak.



We will do some activities in the classroom too. The farmer will explain how to do them. We will be taking turns and sharing with the other students.

The farmer will give us some sheep's wool during one of the activities. The wool is really soft! It also feels a bit oily and has a strong smell that some people don't like.



When it's time to leave the farm, we will collect our bags and walk back to the bus.
